Seoul National University International Summer Program (ISP) 2026

June 22 – July 25, 2026 | Seoul, Korea

About the Program

Since its inception in 2007, the Seoul National University (SNU) International Summer Program (ISP) has provided students from around the world with a unique opportunity to engage in intensive academic coursework, cultural immersion, and global networking. Each year, the program welcomes over 600 students from more than 40 countries.

ISP offers a wide range of courses taught in English across diverse disciplines, including:

- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Business and Economics
- Engineering and Natural Sciences
- Korean Studies, Arts, and Culture
- K-Wave (Hallyu): Korean Pop Culture, Media, and Creative Industries

Teaching Opportunity

SNU is now inviting distinguished faculty members from universities worldwide to join the 2026 International Summer Program as Visiting Professors (Non-tenure-track, Part-time Visiting Faculty). We particularly welcome proposals for innovative, globally oriented, and interdisciplinary courses that foster experiential and comparative learning among international students.

Teaching Conditions

- Course Duration: 5 weeks (June 22 – July 25, 2026; classes conclude before the closing ceremony)
- Teaching Load: One 3-credit course (45 contact hours)
- Language of Instruction: English
- Format: Lectures, seminars, workshops, or project-based learning
- Students: International and SNU undergraduate (graduate) students
- Teaching Assistant: One SNU graduate student will be assigned as a TA (stipend covered by SNU OIA)
- Course Support: Resource materials and classroom activity costs may be supported upon OIA review



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Compensation and Benefits

Honorarium:

- KRW 14 million (**approximately USD 10,000 / GBP 7,500 / EUR 8,500**, tax included) for a 3-credit course
(Payment subject to tax regulations depending on instructor's nationality and residence)

⚠ Note: If the total number of lecture hours falls below the minimum required for academic credit, SNU will be obliged to issue a full tuition refund to students, and consequently, no compensation can be paid to the instructor.

Travel & Accommodation Support (for in-person and hybrid courses):

- Up to KRW 6 million (**approximately USD 4,250 / GBP 3,200 / EUR 3,600**) to cover round-trip airfare (economy class) and accommodation
- On-campus housing at SNU Hoam Faculty House (approx. KRW 70,000/night) may be arranged upon request and subject to availability

Cultural Activities:

- Visiting faculty are invited to participate in various ISP social and cultural programs throughout the session.
